2. Answer the following questions : 2×5=10

- (a) Why is Father Huismans in *A Bend in the River* considered to be a relic of the colonial past?
- (b) What does the mystic drum symbolize in Gabriel Okara's poem, *The Mystic Drum*?
- (c) Mention the two settings used in the short story, *Blow-Up*.
- (d) "I follow a terrible profession." Who is the speaker here? Why is the profession considered 'absurd' by the Little Prince?

- (e) Why does Rebecca's mother disappear in *The Unnatural and Accidental Women*?

3. Answer briefly any *four* of the following :

- (a) Write a short note on Raymond in *A Bend in the River* as a historian.
- (b) Write a note on the use of surrealism in the play, *The Unnatural and Accidental Women*.
- (c) Can Gabriel Okara's poem, *The Mystic Drum* be read as a post-colonial poem? Offer your views.
- (d) Discuss the theme of futility in war as portrayed in Jean Arasanayagam's poem, *Two Dead Soldiers*.
- (e) How does Judith Wright lament the loss of aboriginal culture in her poem, *Bora Ring*?
- (f) Write a short note on some of the literary devices used in *The Little Prince*.

- (a) "*A Bend in the River* shows us the failures of society in post-colonial Africa." Do you think so? Discuss and offer your views on it.

- (b) Examine the major themes of V. S. Naipaul's novel, *A Bend in the River*.
- (c) Show how the concepts of hybridity, race and culture are represented in some of the literary texts of contemporary world literature.
- (d) Write a note on the political context of Shu Ting's poem, *Assembly Line*.
- (e) Comment on the significance of the title of Marie Clements' play, *The Unnatural and Accidental Women*.
- (f) How does Antoine de Saint-Exupery's novella, *The Little Prince* teaches its readers about pain and loss in a world that is difficult to understand?
- (g) "Kishwar Naheed's *The Grass is Really Like Me* is a poem of resistance through assertion." Discuss.
- (h) Justify the appropriateness of the title of Cortazar's short story, *Blow-Up*.

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
